Pure Play Poker Seven-Card Stud high-low is played both for the highest hand and as a High/Low-version for the high and the low hand. The rules and the track of the game are the similar, with little exceptions.

In Seven-Card Stud H/L, as well identified as Seven-Card Stud 8 or Better, the high and the low hand divided the pot. A high hand will constantly exist; a low hand is occasionally not to be established. In that instance, the high hand takes the entire pot in money play poker or in play fun poker played with fake money.

A lower hand is collected of five unsuited cards from A to 8 when you play poker games. The ace is the lowest card. Therefore, the top low hand is A-2-3-4-5. The ranking is decided by the maximum value card, if they are the similar, the next highest etc. In other terms, 3-4-5-6-7 is better (lower) than A-2-3-4-8. A probable flush or straight won't create any dissimilarity in this situation. On the other part, a flush or a straight can create the high hand, and the similar player can get the entire pot with the similar cards.

Otherwise, the rules and the way of the game are similar as in the High-version. The only exemption is that the player with a pair face up is not permitted to double-up on the 4th street in play poker games
